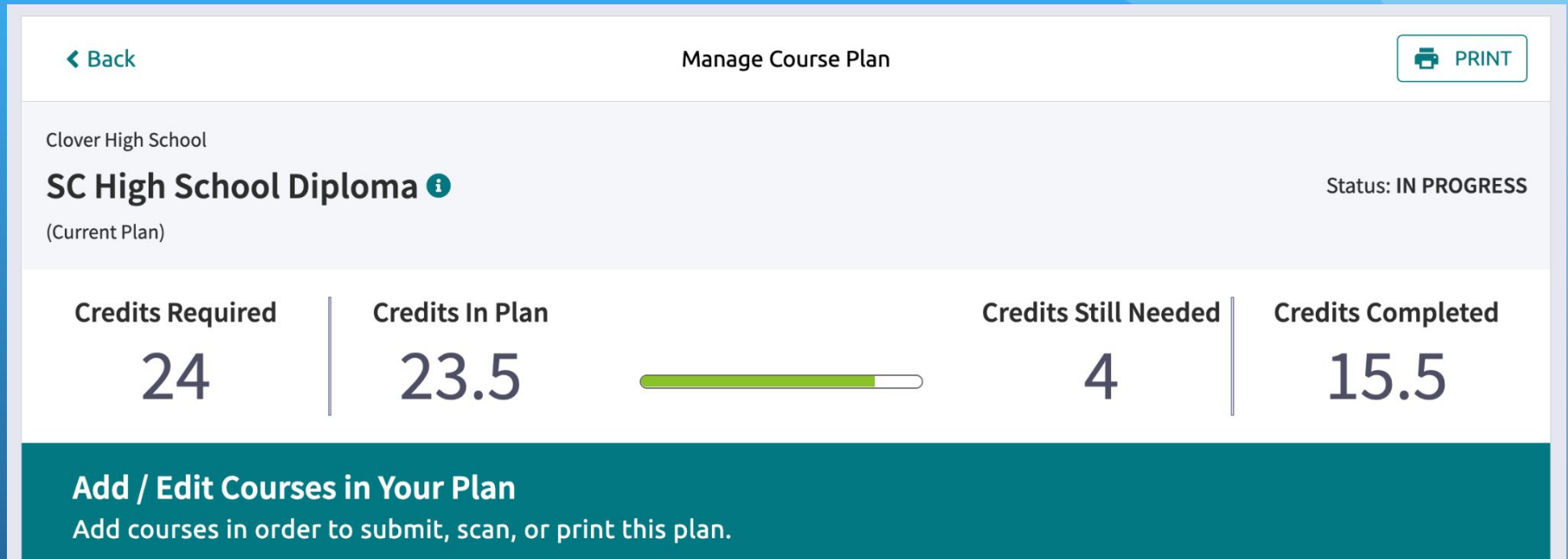

Graduation options - Class of 2025

Alternate Graduation Dates

Summer 2024

- About 10 students each summer
- Students who need only a couple of credits
- No class rank on transcript
- Must apply and meet with your counselor

Winter 2024

- About 115 students
- CSD Auditorium
- Students who only need 3 or 4 classes
- No class rank on transcript
- Must apply and meet with your counselor
- May attend prom as a guest

Traditional Graduation

Spring 2025

- Over 500 students
- Winthrop Coliseum
- Must take at least 6 classes senior year
- May purchase prom tickets if eligible

Early Release and Late Arrival

- Full year Seniors MUST take at least 6 credits
- Winter Graduates MUST take at least 3 credits
- Math and English classes are encouraged for all seniors
- Early Release and Late Arrival are NOT guaranteed

Middle College

Unique opportunity to attend college while in high school.

- Take classes at CHS **AND** York Technical College
- Begin Middle College in 11th or 12th grade
- Students ride a bus FROM Clover High TO York Technical College OR York Comprehensive High.
- Must apply and interview
 - Mature students with no discipline problems and good attendance

Testing Tips

- A. No studying the night before- GET REST!
- B. If unfamiliar with test location, drive-by at some point in the week leading up to the test.
- C. Check testing sites for required ID and acceptable calculators.
- D. No mechanical pencils (Bring two number 2 pencils)
- E. No sugar or empty carbs (you don't want to crash 2.5 hours in). Breakfast of oatmeal, granola, trail mix, etc. is good for energy
- F. Bring tissues, water, granola, a mini pencil sharpener, eraser, and wear a zip hoodie (easy to adjust based on room temp)
- G. Bring a wristwatch with hands. Every section reset it to 12:00. That way you can tell at a glance how much time you have left- good for pacing without burning seconds figuring out time remaining.
- H. DON'T PANIC- Confidence from preparation and breathing exercises should reduce stress.

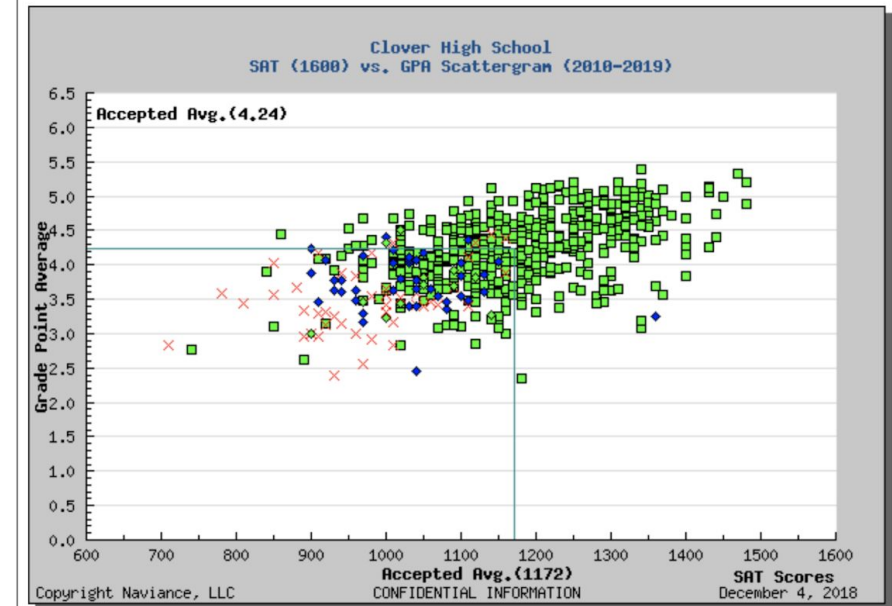

* Four year college

Requires a 3.0 GPA on the SC UGP at the time of high school graduation.

\$2600 for one year

LIFE - at a 2 Year College

* Two Year College

Requires a 3.0 GPA on the SC UGP at the time of high school graduation

\$5000 per year

Good for two years with a 3.0 GPA each year

LIFE - at a 4 Year College

* Four Year College

\$5000 per year

3.0 GPA AND top 30%

OR

3.0 GPA AND 1100 SAT or 22 ACT

Good for four years with a 3.0 GPA each year

PALMETTO FELLOWS

* Two or Four Year College

\$6700 the first year and \$7500 each year thereafter

Top 6% of class AND 25 ACT or 1200 SAT





OR

4.0 GPA AND 31 ACT or 1400 SAT
