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SC-951 AIR FORCE JROTC STUDENT CONTRACT

APPLICATION AND AGREEMENT FOR:

(Print: Last Name, First Name, Middle Initial)

1. **UNDERSTANDING:** Belonging to the cadet corps is a privilege and not a right— Aerospace Science 1 cadets receive a PE credit for successful course completion; Aerospace Science 2 – 4 cadets receive “elective” credits; Aerospace 3H, 4H and 5H receive “honors” credit. The instructors reserve the right to remove anyone from the program if they are not meeting the minimum standards spelled out in this contract.
2. **OBLIGATIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS:** Participation in AFJROTC does not commit or obligate any student to military service. It does not guarantee special consideration if a student chooses to enter any service. However, a cadet who completes two or more years of AFJROTC may qualify for advanced rank upon enlistment in the military. Additionally, students who complete two years of AFJROTC and are enrolled in their senior year are eligible to compete for AFJROTC scholarships.
3. **APPLICATION:** I, the above named cadet, hereby apply for enrollment in the SC-951 Air Force JROTC Program.
4. **AGREEMENT: (Aerospace Science Instructors)** Upon acceptance of this application and the fulfillment of the conditions on the part of the cadet, the Senior Aerospace Science Instructor (SASI) and the Aerospace Science Instructor (ASI) agree to: (1) Instruct the cadet in aerospace science and leadership topics. (2) Help develop the cadet into an informed citizen. (3) Strengthen and develop the cadet’s character. (4) Help the cadet understand his/her role in a democratic republic. (5) If interested, familiarize the cadet with the U. S. Air Force, and the scholarship and career opportunities that the Air Force offers to qualified graduates.
5. **AGREEMENT: (Cadet)** In order to maintain the high standards of courtesy, personal conduct, and appearance required by the Air Force and SC-951, as a cadet, I understand and agree to:
 - A. Meet the standards of behavior, attitude, and courtesy established and taught by the Instructors. I understand and agree that indifference to training or discipline problems such as dishonesty, failure to follow directions of those in authority, initiating a fight, or suspension from school for misbehavior may result in non-selection for future enrollment in AFJROTC in future semesters.
 - B. I will wear the regulation Air Force JROTC uniform on those occasions prescribed by the SASI. Refusal to wear the uniform weekly or improper use of the uniform will result in my removal from AFJROTC. Removal from the program will result in an “F” in the course. Uniform Day is normally every Wednesday. Bring and wear the issued physical training (PT) clothing with proper athletic shoes each PT day. Failure to wear the PT clothing and participate in PT will result in a recommendation for removal and a failing grade in AFJROTC.
 - C. I will maintain the uniform in a clean, properly fitted and repaired manner, and turn in the complete uniform upon demand. I am responsible for the cost of cleaning and loss, theft, or damage of uniform items.
 - D. I will maintain the personal grooming standards established by the Air Force. I will pay particular attention to **military hair cut standards, facial hair, body piercing, tattoos, and body jewelry**, as described in the AFJROTC Cadet Handbook and AFJROTC Instruction 36-2001. **IMPORTANT:** Facial piercings/earrings in the top of the ear, gauge style earrings **MUST** be removed on uniform wear day--no exceptions. Hair extensions cannot exceed 3 1/2 inches in bulk for females. Hair color must be a natural color (i.e. blond, brunette, natural

red ... no blues, pinks, bright red, etc.). **The first grooming inspection will be on Aug 26, 2019. Cadets are expected to have a good ROTC haircut, shave and adhere to all grooming standards for the entire day.**

- E. I must maintain an acceptable standard of academic performance in all classes; complete all assignments given to me by my instructor; and be active in classroom work and the co-curricular activities of AFJROTC. (Cadets should participate in as many co-curricular activities as possible. Community Service credit is earned in this way).
- F. I will respond positively to other cadets who are appointed to leadership positions within the Cadet Wing. Rendering proper military courtesies to instructors and other cadets with senior rank is a necessity. I will express courtesy and respect to administrators, teachers, coaches, and other adults with whom I come into contact. I will conduct myself properly when I am entrusted with a position of leadership.
- G. I will meet the objectives of the Cadet Wing which are to: (1) Encourage a high degree of personal honor, self-reliance, and leadership, (2) Promote patriotism, (3) Develop habits of orderliness and precision, (4) Develop a respect for constituted authority, and (5) Develop the ability to perform basic military skills associated with drill.
- H. I will strive to develop self-discipline and accept personal responsibility for my actions.
- I. I will take proper care of textbook materials provided by the Air Force and return them when requested to do so.
- J. I will read, understand, and **comply** with the requirements and information provided to me in the SC-951 Cadet Handbook and Class Syllabus.

6. DISENROLLMENT PROCEDURES: Cadets who fail to meet/maintain minimum uniform and grooming standards to include dressing out for Physical Training will be subject to disenrollment.

First Offense: Letter of Counseling from Flight Commander and endorsed by JROTC Instructors.

Second Offense: Administrator referral and phone call by JROTC Instructor.

Third Offense: Administrator referral for disenrollment.

PARENTAL/GUARDIAN APPROVAL: I/We hereby give permission for my daughter/son/dependent to enroll in the AFJROTC Program and will encourage her/his participation. **I/We will pay the annual \$30 uniform dry cleaning fee/flight t-shirt fee due no later than September 6th, 2019. Cadets will not be issued a uniform prior to paying this fee and will receive a zero uniform wear grade until paid.** Please contact Major Brian Batson or myself to discuss other options should this pose a financial hardship. If the uniform cleaning fee deposit was paid last year and the cadet was allowed to keep the uniform for this school year, your deposit (if paid) is carried forward. Parents do not have the option of returning the uniform dry cleaned. All cadets will return their uniform on the specified date and the AFJROTC instructors will have all items professionally dry cleaned.

7. My student has read this contract, with particular attention to paragraph number **FIVE** and **SIX**, and understands the requirements of this program. I understand there is no commitment for military service associated with participation in AFJROTC. I will help my daughter/son/dependent maintain the high standards expected of an AFJROTC cadet in SC-951.

8. I understand my student must complete a minimum of 6 Community Service Hours per quarter. This is a graded assignment and documented on the Community Service Log. Helping with household chores, babysitting siblings, etc. are not considered community service for this purpose. Community Service may be performed with JROTC, local community groups, churches, scouting, etc.
